In this exposé, I will detail my process in composing an original anthem commemorating the visitation of the Bishop and the five-year anniversary of the Reverend Karen's institution as Rector of Grace church.



In my studies of opera, and other sung music, it is always the language that comes first. Luckily, I chose to write in English today, so all translation work was reduced to nothing! However, I did need to find a text to set to music. I consulted the Book of Common Prayer which offered two scripts. I chose the one that had better words suited for singing and imagery.


After confirming the text, I had to decide on mood, and speed of the music. I decided the music would begin with a grand organ showcase, and the choir would pick up after some time. The speed would be somewhat march-like, or peppy. The choir would begin in a traditional "5th" based harmony, a symbol of resting place, or exposition, and the tenors would elaborate furthest, singing the sweet "third" note of the chord. The choir would split in a pastoral harmony on the words "Shepherd of Thy people." A brief trumpet call from the organ leads the choir into the highlighted line of the first part, "We give Thee thanks for Thy servant, Karen" as both tenors and sopranos sing up to an F sharp. The choir then gracefully floats down in sweet parallel sixth chords to an unexpected chord of resolution.

The next section modulates from the bright D major, to its relative minor, B minor on the words "We Pray." This reflects the pious mood of the next section. The organ echoes the words of the choir evoking an ethereal mood. The choir then sings in unison "Following her example of a holy life." The next line, "Growing into the stature and fullness of a holy life," has the choir split into rich harmonies, swelling and growing along with the words.

The concluding section is an alternation of unison song, gently expanding to chords. The word that stuck out to me was "reigns," so I made the chords sound regal and powerful. I chose throughout this piece to use "mediant" harmonies, which are somewhat unexpected and lend interest and modernity to the sound. This section almost has an epic, Lord of the Rings sound. Finally, a tradtional "Amen" chorus ends the song.
